The Catchin' for Kids Committee is pleased to announce our plans for the 19th Annual Anglers Club Challenge Tournament, and once again to invite your club to participate in this highlight of the summer fishing season in Hampton Roads.

Several years ago, when the local Tidewater chapter of the CCA was no longer available to support the Club Challenge tournament, Catchin' for Kids stepped up to continue the tournament, preserving what had become a tradition of competition and camaraderie in the Tidewater area.

As those of you know who have participated in prior years, the Anglers Club Challenge is not like most fishing tournaments. It is not a head-to-head competition between anglers; rather, it is a competition between the clubs. There are sixteen different species for which points are awarded. All are in-shore or near-shore species, so the tournament fishing is in the Chesapeake Bay and close to the mouth of the Bay. For each of the designated species, points are awarded on a 3-2-1 scale for the three largest fish by weight. The points are then added up for each participating anglers club for all the designated species, and the winning club is the one with the most total points.

In addition to the sixteen species for which points are awarded, there is non-points "fun" competition, with two side Calcuttas—one for the largest Oyster Toad and the other a "Mystery Calcutta." Last year's Oyster Toad winner was almost three pounds. Other than these two Calcuttas there is no prize money awarded in the Anglers Club Challenge; it is strictly for bragging rights. That fact, however, does not diminish the seriousness with which the anglers approach the competition.

Last year there were seven competing clubs:

Reflecting the intensity of the competition, every team in the tournament scored points.

Enclosed with this letter you will find copies of the Club Challenge Rules and entry forms for the tournament. You will note that this year the Club Challenge has moved to Vinings' Bay Point Marina. We are pleased to be holding the tournament at such an angler-friendly site. The marina management has said there will be plenty of boat and trailer parking with no hassles for our anglers. In addition, there will be wet slips available, at a reduced rate, on a first-come first-served basis. If any of you would like to get more information on that subject, please call me. We hope to see all of the Anglers Clubs again at this year's Club Challenge, and to enjoy a banner year of fishing together.
